**License to Construct and Maintain Electric Lines
Over and Across State Lands in Londonderry**

This license is granted to Public Service Company of New Hampshire d/b/a Eversource Energy (Eversource) to modify and maintain its R187 Line, an existing electric transmission line that extends over and across land owned by the State of New Hampshire in Londonderry.

I. BACKGROUND

On June 30, 2021, Eversource filed a petition with the NH Department of Energy (Department), pursuant to RSA 371:17, requesting a license to modify, reconstruct, and maintain its 115 kV electric transmission line in Londonderry. On September 21, 2021, the Department's Enforcement Division Staff filed a recommendation that the petition be approved and a license granted. II. SUMMARY OF LICENSE

A. Crossing Locations and Construction

This license pertains to Eversource's R187 Line, a 115 kV electric transmission line that extends over and across land parcels owned by the NH Department of

Transportation (NHDOT) in Londonderry and Hudson. The R187 Line crosses a rail trail owned by NHDOT between new, renumbered Structures 5 and 6 northeast of Rockingham Road, and between new, renumbered Structures 12 and 15 adjacent to and across land owned by NHDOT on either side of Interstate 93 in Londonderry.

Locations of crossing structures are further specified in the petition filings. The license authorizes the replacement of six existing laminated wood structures with weathered steel structures, and the transfer of three existing transmission conductors and one existing shield wire to the new structures.

B. Regulatory Requirements

Eversource is responsible for obtaining any and all other federal, state, or local permits required by authorities having jurisdiction for the construction and installation of the proposed crossings. According to the petition, Eversource will obtain a NH Department of Environmental Services (DES) Statutory Permit by Notification for temporary impacts to wetlands in Londonderry prior to construction.

C. Property Rights

Eversource stated that any potential impacts or concerns affecting abutters to the State land crossings in Londonderry will be mitigated because the R187 Line is an existing line and the crossing structures are being replaced and rebuilt within existing easements.

D. Service to the Public and the Effect on Public Rights

According to the petition, the existing crossings were constructed, operated, and maintained to meet the reasonable requirements of service to the public. Eversource affirmed that the proposed modifications will continue to meet that public need, and


will not substantially affect the public's use and enjoyment of the identified State lands in Londonderry. The line modifications are designed and will be constructed and maintained in accordance with the 2012 National Electrical Safety Code (NESC).

III. DEPARTMENT DECISION

Eversource is authorized, pursuant to RSA 371:17, *et seq.*, to construct, install, operate, and maintain electric lines over and across State lands in Londonderry, as described in its petition and depicted in its filings and as specified in the Enforcement Division's recommendation. Based on the factual representations set forth in the petition and the recommendation, the Department finds that the requested crossing amendments are necessary to meet the reasonable requirements of reliable service to the public, as required by RSA 371:17, and that the requested license may be exercised without substantially affecting public rights in the subject lands at the crossing sites in Londonderry, as required for approval under RSA 371:20. Therefore, the petition is approved.

We require a copy of this license to be provided to the Town Clerk of Londonderry by first class mail no later than December 6, 2021, with a signed affidavit of compliance filed with the Department no later than 10 days following the issuance of the license.
