Commission and Department of Energy's Chapter 700 rules, rules for sewer utilities. These rule sets, when taken together, are not intended to substantively change the existing rules. Rather, they are intended to reflect the division of regulatory responsibilities between the

Commission and the Department of Energy following the establishment of the Department in July of

My name is Eric Wind. I am a Senior Advisor at the Commission. And I will serve as the Designee for the Chairman of the Commission for this hearing. This hearing occurs in Commission Docket DRM 23-083.

Examiner with the Department of Energy. And I am serving as the Designee of the Commissioner of the Department of Energy.

1 The Department is here to receive 2. comments on the DOE's proposed new En 700 rules. 3 These rules are new, but, taken together with the 4 PUC's 700 rules, they're not intended to 5 substantively change the existing rules, and 6 merely they are intended to reflect the division 7 of regulatory responsibilities. 8 Thank you. 9 PRESIDING OFCR. WIND: All right. 10 Let's go around the room. Attorney Chiavara, do 11 you have any comments on the 700 rules? 12 MS. CHIAVARA: I have nothing for the 1.3 700 rules. Thank you. 1 4 PRESIDING OFCR. WIND: Attorney Brown?

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MS, BROWN: Good morning. And my apologies for still not being able to pull up a copy of DOE's 700 proposed rules. But I will speak with respect to the existing PUC's 703.03 rule, and however it's referenced in the new DOE rules.

PRESIDING OFCR. WIND: Okay.

MS, BROWN: That particular rule pertains to "Disconnection of Service". And many of our clients get that it's against public

policy to prohibit disconnection of sewer, because of the mess that that makes.

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But, in taking away that enforcement mechanism, we're going to brainstorm to try to suggest that the DOE consider some other method, perhaps leveraging with other utilities to collect bills, or allowing that by rule, so that some other utility can be stopped, disconnected, somehow offer leverage.

Because the way that the 703.03 rule operates in practice now is the bill has to get very large before the Company finds it worthwhile to hire an attorney to pursue it in court.

There's no way to stop it sooner at a smaller amount owed. So, you will see some comments from me on 703.03.

Other than that, no other comments on the 700 rules. Thank you.
