Approval of Preliminary Fiscal Year 2022 Renewable Energy Fund Program Budgets

Summary

This memorandum confirms Department of Energy (Department) approval for the establishment of preliminary fiscal year 2022 (FY22) program budgets for the Renewable Energy Fund (REF) as set forth in the Preliminary Funding Allocations by Program (Table 2) on page 2. Further, the Department informs stakeholders of the following actions:

- All program applications received and approved prior to July 1, 2021 will be paid upon project completion and approval of a Step 2 application, provided that the project meets all program terms and conditions. Those applications will be paid with FY21 carry-forward funds which are not included in the preliminary FY22 program allocations.
- FY22 applications will be reviewed on a first-come, first-served basis.
- The Department will continue to accept new applications for rebate programs until specific program funding allocations are fully utilized.
- Staff will establish waitlists for specific programs when the program receives applications in excess of its preliminary funding allocation.
- Requests for Proposals will not be issued by the Department for renewable energy generation
 projects in the Non-Residential Sector (C&I Competitive Grant program) or for the Low and
 Moderate Income Community Solar Grant (LMI Grant program) programs until the final FY22
 REF program allocations are established and approved by the Department.

Funding Analysis

Based on the REF FY22 Statement of Appropriation, \$2,000,000 is available for allocation to FY22 grant and rebate programs. Given that the FY21 program allocations are fully expended, the Department authorizes the allocation of \$1,000,000 to enable Department staff to open the rebate programs to new applications. Table 1 presents the statutorily required funding breakdown between sectors.
