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5. Short Title: **En 1400 Rules for Pipeline Utilities**

6. (a) Summary of what the rule says and of any proposed amendments:

The new Chapter En 1400 rules regarding pipeline public utilities reports, which are proposed by the Department of Energy (Department), modify the existing Puc 1400 rules, such as by replacing the term “Commission” with the term “Department,” in order to effectuate the transfer of the entirety of these regulatory responsibilities regarding certain reporting from the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) to the Department. The En 1400 rules also simplify the definitions of utilities by retaining the reference to RSA 362:2, but omitting any paraphrasing of the statute.

The new En 1400 rules otherwise retain the provisions in the existing Puc 1400 rules and apply to reporting by pipeline utilities regarding gas, crude petroleum, refined petroleum products, or combinations of petroleum products in the State.

6. (b) Brief description of the groups affected:

The En 1400 rules generally apply to any public utility that owns or operates any gas pipeline, including pumping stations, storage depots, and other facilities, for the transportation, distribution, or sale of gas, crude petroleum, refined petroleum products, or combinations of petroleum products.
